Proceedings

Meeting called to order at 6:08 PM by President, Moose Hancock.

Approval of Minutes

The minutes were approved, by the group, as presented. Minutes posted at montanaclays.com.

Public Forum

Tom Yurk inquired if the State Shoot would go East to West each year. The Board responded that all available clubs are asked each year if they want to host and that there has not been a conflict of multiple clubs wanting to host in same year because the rotation precedent has been honored.

Lupold introduced Todd Church as the new manager of Blue Creek Sport Shooting Complex.

Lupold moved to close the Public Forum section, Duncan seconded the motion and the Public Forum section was closed.

Report of Officers

President: Hancock reported that the Board had been working to clean-up the bylaws and had purchased three pump guns from CZ to be given at the State Championship for the next three years by random drawing.

Treasurer: T. Duncan reported, for Treasurer Ross Duncan, a current checking account balance of \$13,433.80. Expenses totaled \$2154.30. All clubs were current on target fees. Income totaled just shy of \$4,000.00 in targets fees which was far beyond projections. Duncan thanked all shooters present for shooting registered tournaments! All twelve youth shooters would receive a \$100 subsidy towards their entry fees. Kiel questioned if non-resident youth shooters should receive the subsidy as bylaws indicate that only Montana kids should receive that money. The Board decided to send the money to all youth shooters because the current Objection Plan was in place to reduce the amount of money in the MSCA account.

Bylaws Committee: Lupold read proposed changes to the bylaws. All in attendance were provided literature. Duncan moved to present the proposed changes to the membership for voting, Smart seconded the motion. All in attendance were in favor and all bylaw changes were approved.

2020 State Championship

Hancock reported that Billings Rod & Gun was not interested in hosting the 2020 State Championship. Gallatin Sporting Clays expressed their interest and was awarded the shoot at a to be determined date.

MSCA Elections

Hancock reported that of 160 registered shooters in the state 44 votes were turned in. Chase explained that this was a good percentage in responses from the membership. Hancock read results that Tyler Duncan was re-elected for Vice President, Lee Richards and Wally Wilkinson were re-elected for Director positions. Kiel asked to hear the number of votes for each candidate and Hancock read the number of votes for all persons.

Pump Gun Drawing

Riley Hancock drew the winner of the MSCA sponsored Pump Gun. All Main Event entrants were included in the drawing. Brian Stein was awarded the gun.

New Business

No additional business was presented or discussed.

Adjournment

Wilkinson moved to adjourn the meeting, Smart seconded the meeting and the meeting ended at 6:38 PM.
